The following is a synopsis of some the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of January 2010.

Patrol

January 1, 2010 An officer on foot patrol of the front beach observed a male subject stumble and fall down the stairs at a local establishment. The officer asked the subject where he was staying and he stated just down the street, so the officer escorted the subject to the hotel where he stated that he was staying. When the subjects door key failed to open the door, the manager advised that the subject was not a guset at that location. The officer walked with the subject, who was grossly intoxicated, attempting to assist him in finding out exactly where he was staying. When the subject agreed to check into a hotel he became belligerent toward the officer in the lobby then proceeded to take a swing at the officer with a closed fist to the officers head. The officer blocked the punch and took the subject to ground and charged him with Public Intoxication and Simple Assault.

January 1, 2010 The Duty Captain of the Isle of Palms Fire Department reported that he observed an intoxicated female subject walk from a nearby establishment then get into a vehicle parked on JC Long Boulevard. An officer responded to investigate and located the female asleep in a vehicle. Once awakened and asked to exit the vehicle, she was unable to stand without assistance. Due to her level of intoxication she was unable to provide a contact number or to locate a friend to drive her home, so she was subsequently charged with Public Intoxication.

January 3, 2010 Just before 2 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle turn left onto Carolina Boulevard from 7th Avenue then sharply turn into the left lane riding on the wrong side of the road then pass 6th Avenue swerving side to side. The officer stopped

the vehicle and immediately detected an odor of alcohol. After conducting several Field Sobriety Tests, the officer elected to release the driver to the custody of her father and charged her with Reckless Driving.

January 4, 2010 An officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector after observing a lane violation prior to entry to the Connector. The officer made the determination that the driver did not have a license to drive and was in possession of an open beer. He was charged with No Drivers License and Open Container.

January 8, 2010 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for an illegal lane change and while speaking to the driver was presented with a Brazilian passport. The driver did not have a valid driver's license. The driver was issued tickets for No DL and Improper Right Turn. Contact was made with the driver's employer and a licensed driver responded to drive the vehicle.

January 8, 2010 Just after 4 A.M., an officer on patrol observed a vehicle enter the roadway and begin to weave significantly within the lane of traffic on Palm Boulevard then once the vehicle barely negotiated the curve at 21st Avenue the vehicle then straddled the lane markers and traveled in two lanes then glanced off of the cement raised center median. Once stopped the officer spoke to the driver and determined that he had no driver's license. He was taken into custody charged with No DL and Reckless Driving.

January 9, 2010 After stopping a vehicle on the Connector for speeding the officer determined that the driver's license was suspended. The driver was charged with Careless Operation, DUS, Failure to Surrender a Suspended License Plate, and No Proof of Ownership.

January 10, 2010 After stopping a vehicle on Palm Boulevard for speeding the officer determined that the driver's license was suspended for failure to pay a traffic ticket. The driver was charged with Speeding, DUS, and NRVC.

January 12, 2010 An officer responded to a vehicle fire in the 1000 block of Palm Boulevard. The fire department responded and extinguished the fire. The owner stated while driving down the street he smelled smoke and stopped to look under the hood, then noticed flames coming from under the dashboard. The vehicle was towed from the area.

January 13, 2010 An officer who had originally arrested a male subject on December 31, 2009 served an Arrest Warrant on the same subject for Threatening the Life of a Public Official stemming from threats he made to the officer after his December arrest. The suspect's attorney made arrangements for his client to meet the officer at the Detention Center for processing and bond hearing.

January 14, 2010 Officers responded to a condominium unit on Palmetto Drive in Wild Dunes, where a domestic dispute had been reported. Officers met with the victim, who had visible facial injuries, who stated that his son who was extremely intoxicated,

had assaulted him while the family was eating dinner. Officers entered the unit and observed broken glass on the floor and a hole in a nearby wall. The suspect was taken into custody charged with Simple Assault. All family members present were visiting from Canada.

January 14, 2010 An officer responded to a residence on Hartnett Boulevard at the request of fire department personnel, who were treating a female subject for injuries sustained in a possible assault. Parents of the subject stated that upon their arrival to the residence from out of state, they found their daughter in a semi-unconscious state with several lacerations and contusions. It was readily apparent that the subject was also in a state of alcohol intoxication. The subject was transported to a local hospital and admitted. An Investigator responded to the hospital to gather information and speak to family members and another responded to the residence to process any possible physical evidence present. Criminal Investigators have determined that no assault took place and all injuries were the result of falls in the residence while intoxicated. Family members made arrangements for the subject to be flown out of state to a Rehabilitation facility.

January 17, 2010 After midnight officers responded to a residence on 43rd Avenue, where a neighbor had reported a loud party. Officers found five subjects on the back deck playing beer pong. Two of the subjects were found to be under the age of twenty-one and were charged with Underage Possession of Beer. One of those subjects identified himself as the homeowner's son, which resulted in him also being charged with a Violation of the Noise Ordinance.

January 17, 2010 At approximately 2:20 A.M., officers responded to a residence on Cameron Boulevard regarding a domestic violence complaint. The 911 operator advised the officers that the complainant was being assaulted by his wife, while he was attempting to leave the residence to call police. The victim advised officers that his wife had become intoxicated in Charleston then got their vehicle stuck in a ditch. He stated that he went to that location got the vehicle out of the ditch and drove his wife home. He stated that after arriving home his wife began punching him in the mouth and tried to strangle him while they were discussing the incident. The victim had several visible scratches and fresh blood on his face. The suspect was taken into custody charged with Criminal Domestic Violence.

January 19, 2010 Just before 10 P.M., an officer stopped on JC Long Boulevard to speak with a female pedestrian, who appeared to be intoxicated. The female subject became belligerent and began to use loud profanity, drawing the attention of nearby restaurant patrons. The officer made telephone contact with the subject's mother in Mount Pleasant to arrange for a ride home. While awaiting her mothers arrival she abruptly decided to run away toward Ocean Boulevard. The officer caught up to the subject, where she was then taken into custody and placed in the rear seat of a police vehicle. At the same time the officer was dealing with the female, a citizen reported that there had been a possible collision and a vehicle was resting against the side of the Bellsouth Building at JC Long Boulevard and Pavilion Boulevard. It was immediately determined that the female subject owned that vehicle. The subject then deliberately

banged her head against the caged partition of the police vehicle causing a laceration to her forehead. Fire department personnel present provided first aid and requested that EMS transport her for further treatment. EMS personnel requested that an officer ride with them, due to the subject's combative nature. Upon arrival at the hospital the subject became enraged and fought all hospital personnel who attempted to treat her. While restraining her legs on a gurney for treatment, she managed to kick the arresting officer in the head. Rather than attempt to incarcerate the subject, she was charged with Disorderly Conduct and Assault on a Police Officer and released to the custody of a parent, who was pursuing a psychiatric evaluation for admission.

January 20, 2010 A contractor working at a construction site on marsh Island Lane reported a concrete saw valued at \$1,250 missing from the jobsite. He was able to provide a serial number and an accurate description of the property, which enabled an Investigator to locate the item in a local Pawn Shop. An Arrest Warrant has been prepared for the responsible party for Receiving Stolen Property and the property was returned to the victim.

January 20, 2010 A subject staying at a condominium complex in Wild Dunes reported that a suitcase containing jewelry that she had left in her room was missing. The case was assigned to an Investigator, who determined that a female providing cleaning service had pawned all of the items at a local pawnshop. The stolen items were all recovered and the subject was arrested for Grand Larceny.

January 21, 2010 A resident of 30th Avenue reported that a male subject driving a pick-up truck had driven into his driveway and into the garage of his residence. The officers encountered an intoxicated male subject having difficulty maintaining his balance, who then became loud and belligerent in the presence of neighbors. He was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication and DUS. The vehicle was towed from the scene.

January 22, 2010 An officer on patrol on the Connector stopped a vehicle for speeding and while speaking to the female driver determined that she was homeless and was coming to the Isle of Palms to save the universe. A computer check of the subject indicated that she was listed as a missing person through the Williamsburg County Sheriff's Office. The officer assumed custody of the subject until a Williamsburg County Deputy responded to return her to her family.

January 31, 2010 An officer on patrol on the Connector observed a vehicle tracking out of the lane of traffic then overcorrect several times. The officer stopped the vehicle and while speaking to the driver immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol and observed that the driver's eyes were glassy and bloodshot. The driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed. The driver was taken into custody and administered a Datamaster Test, which registered a .21% level of alcohol. The driver was charged with DUI and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Personnel/Community Relations

January 9, 2010 Officers met Mount Pleasant Police Department vehicles near Seaside Farms and provided escort to several busloads of children with cancer and their families across the Connector and into Wild Dunes where they were attending a get-away weekend, sponsored by Camp Merrytimes. Later that evening, an official of Camp Merrytimes presented the police department with a plaque thanking us for our years of involvement in their yearly weekend for the sick children.

January 26, 2010 Sgt. Jimenez was awarded Employee of the Month at the monthly City Council Meeting. Several citizens recognized him for his initiative in taking care of two elderly sisters. He arranged for a translator, made contact with family members out of country then insured their safe return to Brazil. He often checked on their welfare and saw that neighbors reported any issues with the sisters until their departure.

January 30, 2010 Sgt. Ambas and PFC Thompson participated in the Recreation Department Arcade Day by registering bicycles to those in attendance. Those who registered were then able to participate in the Arcade Day for free.

January 31, 2010 For the month of January, officers discovered two businesses and six homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of fifty-seven Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise them that an officer checked their business during the night.
