The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of June, 2011.

### Patrol

(06/01/11: Wednesday)

A concerned citizen called to report that while in the 1100 block of Ocean Boulevard, he had observed a male and female engaged in a heated argument, which escalated into a physical altercation when the male subject grabbed the female and forced her into a vehicle, immediately departing the area in a white Jeep. Police Department Telecommunications Officer provided the vehicle description to surrounding agencies, as Isle of Palms Police Officers searched the area, with negative findings.

(06/02/11: Thursday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his rental property and stole a quantity of clothing from his locked owner's closet.

(06/03/11: Friday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered onto his property and stole his daughter's skateboard from the front porch of his residence.

(06/04/11: Saturday)

Victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his unsecured bicycle from the drive of his residence.

(June 6: Monday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his bicycle from within his unsecured garage.

Officers met with a victim who had called the police to report that unknown person(s) had stolen his bicycle off the bed of his pick-up truck.

At approximately 3:07 pm, an Officer conducted a lawful traffic stop on a vehicle with an expired license plate. While speaking with the driver, the Officer detected a strong smell of marijuana emitting from within the vehicle. The driver advised the Officer that he did not have his driver's license because his

wallet had been stolen. A lawful search was conducted of the vehicle, at which time the Officer located a quantity of a green, plant-like material (GPM). The GPM field-tested presumptive positive as marijuana. During the search, the Officer also located a wallet containing the driver's information, as well as a driver's license containing false information. The subject was detained and charged accordingly.

Officers were dispatched to the Forest Trail area in reference to a fight in progress. Upon arriving on scene, Officers observed only one male subject, later identified as the victim, standing outside the residence. The subject stated that when he returned home from his run, he observed a white male subject inside his residence. The victim advised that he confronted the subject, who eventually fled the scene on foot. An Investigator was notified and responded to process the scene. Items of evidence were located, which included telephone numbers of individuals possibly related to the suspect or who were actually involved in the incident. The Investigator made calls to the telephone numbers, and was able to identify the offender. Later in the evening, the suspect called 911 from 1206 Palm Boulevard (The Kangaroo Express) requesting medical attention. Officers arrived on scene and in speaking with the subject, learned that he was in fact the subject that had unlawfully entered the victim's residence. Further, during the preliminary investigation, it was determined that the same subject had an outstanding warrant from another local law enforcement agency for Burglary. After receiving medical treatment, the subject was transported to jail.

### (Tuesday: June 7)

The City of Isle of Palms Recreation Department Director notified the police in reference to vandalism that had occurred to the Recreation Department, sometime during the evening of 06/06/11. Video was collected, at which time the Director was able to identify the three juvenile perpetrators. Later the same date, the Director observed two of the three offenders and notified the police.

### (Wednesday: June 8)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) entered onto her property and stole a flower pot containing a 20 year old plant.

### (Thursday: June 9)

At approximately 11:02 pm, Officers were dispatched to the Grand Pavilion in reference to an assault, that had just occurred. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with the On-Duty Property Manager, who was the victim of the assault. The Manager reported that he had received a complaint from some guests regarding a noise disturbance in the Grand Pavilion area. After speaking with the complainants, the Manager stated that he located the two subjects that were being loud and causing the disturbance, both being intoxicated. After assaulting the Manager, both subjects were seen running into one of the Grand Pavilion units. Officers responded to the unit to speak with the perpetrators, locating one of the subjects sitting outside. As Officers approached the subject, he fled the scene on foot. The subject was caught and detained. An Officer remained on scene with the one subject that did not run, eventually, placing the second subject under arrest, as well.

### (June 13: Monday)

Unknown person(s) unlawfully and forcefully entered into a local business, during non-business hours, and stole a quantity of cash. Investigators responded to the scene and collected trace evidence that is currently under further forensic analysis. The case has been assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division.

At approximately 8:28 am, consequent to a lawful traffic stop, the operator of the vehicle was placed under arrest after the Officer determined that her driver's license was suspended.

(June 14: Tuesday)

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on the Isle of Palms Connector at approximately 12:30 am, after observing a number of traffic violations. While speaking with the operator of the vehicle, and after a preliminary investigatory interview; the Officer recognized an adequate amount of individual indicators to determine that the faculties of the driver were materially and appreciably impaired. The operator was placed under arrest and charged with Driving Under the Influence.

### (June 15: Wednesday)

At 12:27 am, Officers were dispatched to a Burglary in progress. The victim was able to provide a description of the perpetrator she observed in her residence. Officers located the subject while responding to the scene. The victim was able to positively identify the same, who was subsequently placed under arrest and charged with Burglary, 1st Degree.

The victim reported that unknown person(s) had entered into his unlocked vehicle, which was parked in the driveway of his Grand Pavilion residence, and stole a number of personal items from within the console.

### (June 16: Thursday)

The victim reported that unknown person(s) took and carried away fishing equipment from the bed of his pick-up truck, while it was parked in the 1400 block of Ocean Boulevard.

### (June 17: Friday)

Officers met with the victim of a petit larceny which occurred on the beach in the 3000 block of Palm Boulevard. The victim reported that he had left some personal items, unattended, on the beach while he entered the surf. When he returned, approximately an hour later, observed his property missing.

A victim met with an Officer at the City of Isle of Palms Public Safety Building to report a larceny that had occurred last month, during her visit to her secondary residence. The victim stated that unknown person(s) entered into her unlocked vehicle, which was parked underneath her Wild Dunes condominium, and stole a number of personal items.

### (June 20: Monday)

An officer on patrol observed a vehicle make an illegal turn out a business parking lot and initiated a traffic stop. A check of one of the passenger's identification revealed an unpaid traffic ticket. The subject was cited and released.

A male victim reported the theft and subsequent use of his bank debit card. CID has developed leads and identified a suspect.

An officer working off-duty at a local resort was approached by two underage males, consuming alcohol, who asked the officer for assistance. When it was determined they were both 20 years of age each was cited and released for underage possession.

### (June 21: Tuesday)

A male resident reported the theft of prescription medication from his residence. The victim named a potential suspect (family member) but insisted he did not want to pursue charges, instead he needed the report to present to the pharmacy for proof of the loss.

A victim reported the theft of a camera and flashlight from his vehicle overnight. It is unknown if the vehicle was secured. Investigation continues.

### (June 22: Wednesday)

A local resident reported a craigslist scam, in which he was contacted regarding an item he listed for sale. The potential buyer sent a check for an amount above the sale price and was requested to send the remainder back to the buyer, via wire transfer. The victim recognized this as a common scam and submitted all correspondence to the reporting officer. CID is investigating.

### (June 23: Thursday)

An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for speeding and determined the 18 year old driver was in possession of a beer and liquor, some of which was opened. The female was charged with underage possession, open container and the moving violation, and lodged at the detention center.

A victim reported the theft of a small amount of change and a gift card from his vehicle overnight. The victim doesn't wish to pursue charges.

A victim reported the theft of cash and a credit card from her unlocked vehicle overnight. CID continues to investigate.

A vehicle was stopped for speeding and the driver was found to be in possession of a quantity of marijuana. He was charged with the drug offense and transported to the detention center.

A victim reported the theft of a radar detector, GPS unit, sunglasses and DVD's from his unlocked vehicle overnight. The investigation is continuing.

### (June 24:Friday)

An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for a traffic offense and was suspicious of the driver being under the influence of alcohol. The driver refused all field sobriety and chemical tests, and was arrested for DUI and lodged at the detention center.

### (June 26: Sunday)

A victim reported the theft of her bicycle outside a local business while she was working. Investigation continues.

A witness reported seeing a male subject remove a GPS unit from an unsecured vehicle in the parking lot of a local business. The witness followed the suspect's vehicle and officers were able to locate the vehicle and conduct a traffic stop. The driver was subsequently charged with Driving Under Suspension and Open Container, while 2 passengers were charged with the break-in. The GPS unit was returned to the victim.

(June 27: Monday) – An officer responded to a local liquor store due to a patron presenting a fake ID. The 17 year old female suspect was taken into custody for possession of a false driver's license and purchase of liquor under age 21. The female was also charged with simple possession of marijuana after a quantity was found in her vehicle prior to towing. The teen was transported to the detention center and lodged.

(June 28: Tuesday) An officer on patrol near the front beach area heard what sounded like fireworks being discharged on the beach. Two officers entered the beach and immediately observed fireworks being shot horizontally, in the direction of the dunes and Sea Cabins. A male subject was charged with the fireworks offense, as well as for an outstanding traffic citation, and released on his own recognizance.

Investigators assisted Agents from the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) in locating and capturing a fugitive, wanted in three states. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

(June 29: Wednesday) A male victim reported the theft of prescription, controlled substances from his vehicle, which showed evidence of forceful entry. Investigation continues.

Two victims reported items stolen from a single, unsecured vehicle, which included a wallet, two cellular telephones, a driver's license and a debit card. CID is investigating.

An altercation was reported, and after interviewing all parties the brother of the victim was taken into custody and charged with Assault 3rd Degree and lodged at the County Detention Center.

A male subject reported the theft of his bicycle from outside his residence.

(June 30: Thursday) An island visitor reported the theft of currency from her purse in her room. A lead is currently being pursued by investigators.

An island visitor reported the theft of an electronic tablet from her room. Information regarding access to the room has been shared with investigators for follow-up.

A local resident reported the theft of a watch from her vehicle. The victim was unable to determine if the break-in to the vehicle occurred at her home or at an island restaurant she visited. Investigation continues.

Complaints were received regarding a male subject harassing visitors and attempting to gain access to the Sea Cabins pier (private property), with an unleashed dog. Responding officers located the male, who became belligerent with officers and was taken into custody for Disorderly Conduct. He was also charged with Dog at Large, as well as an unpaid traffic citation. A hold was placed on the male for an outstanding warrant from Mt. Pleasant Police.

### Personnel/Community Relations

Investigators conducted Safety and Property Surveys for several local businesses and made recommendations regarding crime prevention techniques, to include Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) concepts.

For the month of June, officers discovered 51 businesses and 26 homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of 77 Victim of Crime Forms or Property Security Check Forms were issued to business or homeowners for various violations noted, or to advise that an officer checked their property during the night while on patrol.
