The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of August 2015.

Saturday, August 1st

Driving Under the Influence – 14th Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that he was under the influence. The Officer observed an open container of beer in the cup holder of the center console. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he provided a breath sample with a BAC of .17%. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, August 2nd

Disorderly Conduct – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An Officer heard yelling and screaming while patrolling the area. Further investigation revealed two subjects on the third floor of a local hotel were throwing unopened beer cans into the crowd on the deck of another local establishment. Both subjects were located, found to be intoxicated, arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

Aggravated Assault – 1400 Block Palm Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of an assault at a local restaurant. Further investigation determined that two employees had been in a physical altercation. One subject struck the other in the face, knocking out a tooth. The injured subject was transported to a local hospital and the other subject was arrested and transported to Charleston County Detention Center.

Theft from a Motor Vehicle – 600 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his unlocked vehicle and stole a camera, laptop, watch and other items valued at approximately \$6,900. The victim was able to provide a serial number for the watch, which was entered into NCIC as stolen. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, August 3rd

Simple Assault – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that a former employee entered his business walked up and punched him in the face and then left. Officers located the subject at his residence with the assistance of Mt. Pleasant Police Department and placed him under arrest. The subject was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, August 7th

Wire / Computer Fraud – 2900 Block Palm Boulevard

A victim reported that she had located a rental listing on Craigslist and paid the person responsible for renting the property \$1150. When her group arrived at the address she had rented, she discovered the property was already occupied. Contact was made with the rental property manager, who knew nothing of the victim's contract or deposit. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, August 8th

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 6th Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 55 MPH in a 35 MPH speed zone. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that he was under the influence. When asked how much he had drunk, the driver replied a couple. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged at the Detention Center.

Public Intoxication – JC Long Boulevard

An Officer on patrol observed a subject stumbling down the middle of the lane with cars having to swerve around him. The Officer stopped the subject and checked to make sure he was okay, but found that he was extremely intoxicated and had no one that could pick him up. The subject was arrested and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, August 9th

Disorderly Conduct – 500 Block Carolina Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of six (6) people fighting and screaming in the driveway of a residence. Upon making contact with the group, it was determined that one of the subjects was extremely intoxicated and arguing about driving to a hotel, with the others trying to stop him. Officers attempted to calm the situation, but the intoxicated subject continued to be unreasonable and yelling. The subject was arrested and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 500 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered into his vehicle and stole his firearm. The victim was able to provide the serial number of the firearm, which was entered into NCIC as stolen. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 4th Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a report of reckless driving on a motorcycle. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that he was under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that he only had two drinks at a local bar. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, which he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Wednesday, August 12th

Motor Vehicle Theft – Grand Pavilion / Beach Access

A victim reported that a utility golf cart was stolen from the parking area. Officers patrolling the area saw the golf cart driving on the roadway and when approached, took off running. Officers were able to locate all subjects who had hidden in different areas in the bushes and lying on the ground near a fence. The subjects were arrested and placed on trespass in the resort.

Thursday, August 13th

Theft from a Motor Vehicle – 30 Block Back Court Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a beach wheel chair from the bed of his pickup truck. The approximate value of the item is \$1,200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, August 14th

Simple Possession of Marijuana – Pavilion Drive / JC Long Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for a seatbelt violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license. When asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle, the occupant said that there was "weed" in the suitcase and gave the Officer permission to retrieve the baggie. The Officer asked the occupant if there was anything else illegal in the vehicle and the occupant said that there was a baggie of "weed" under the driver's seat, which the Officer retrieved. The occupant was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, August 15th

Driving Under the Influence – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer observed two intoxicated subjects, whom had gotten into a taxi earlier, attempting to drive off in their vehicle, which they had been told to leave parked. The Officer stopped the vehicle and upon contact with the driver, determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver stated that he only had two mixed drinks earlier and it was determined that he was under the age of 21. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, which he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, August 18th

Grand Larceny – 2400 Block Cameron Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen several televisions, computers and an X-Box from her rental property, with the value of the items being approximately \$2,970. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation, which resulted in locating the items at a local pawnshop. CID was able to recover most of the items, but the victim no longer wished to cooperate in the investigation.

Wednesday, August 19th

Driving Under the Influence – Ocean Boulevard / 3rd Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple equipment violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that he was under the influence. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver stated that he was a diabetic, at which time the Officer requested EMS. EMS determined that the driver's sugar level were well within the normal range and he was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, which during the testing he became uncooperative and refused to provide a breath sample. The subject was transported to a local hospital for further evaluation.

Grand Larceny – 100 Block Charleston Boulevard

A subject made contact with an Officer regarding items she had stolen several months ago. The subject had recently completed medical treatment and wanted to take responsibility for her unlawful actions. During the period when the subject was, working for the victim it is estimated that over \$10,600 worth of jewelry was stolen. Based on confirmation with the victim that the items described by the subject were missing and the admission of the subject, she was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Sunday, August 23rd

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that she was under the influence. When asked, the driver stated that she drank four beers at a local establishment before driving. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, which produced a result of .06% BAC. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

Friday, August 28th

Petit Larceny – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his wallet, credit cards and cash while he was staying in a rental property. The value of the items stolen is approximately \$120. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her iPhone while she was walking on the beach. The approximate value of the item is \$200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, August 29th

Driving Under Suspension – H.L. Hunley Bridge

An Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 47 MPH in a posted 35 MPH speed zone. Further investigation revealed that the driver's license was suspended. The driver was arrested for DUS 3rd offense based on previous suspensions and he was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 3rd Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations, to include littering. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that he was under the influence. When asked if he had been drinking, the driver stated that he drank a lot. The Officer requested the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion, was arrested. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, which resulted in a .20% BAC. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Monday, August 31st

Petit Larceny – 9th Avenue Beach Access

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his surfboard that he had left near the dunes while he was surfing on another board. The approximate value of the item stolen is \$800. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Community Service Mentions

During the month of August 2015, Officers issued One (1) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and sixteen (16) Property Security Check notices.

On August 4, 2015, the Department hosted its first National Night Out event in conjunction with the IOP Recreation Department. National Night Out works to bring the community and law enforcement closer together, building stronger community relationships. We had approximately 200 citizens in attendance and had a jump castle, face painting, car seat installation / check station, dog tag sales, bicycle registrations / inspections, emergency vehicles on display and ice cream. There was also a safety question answering station, where adults and children who correctly answered basic safety questions received a prize, which were donated by many of the local businesses on the island. Officer Louise Hardy, who did a great job making this a successful event, organized the National Night Out event. We also want to thank the personnel at the IOP Recreation Department who assisted with this great event.

Detective Sergeant Swain conducted an interview with the local media about rental property frauds found on Craigslist and other social media. There have been several victims who rented a home or condominium only to arrive; finding does not exist or is legally rented. In addition, the Department posted a Public Service Announcement with information on www.iop.net, the City's website.

Officers were assigned to conduct enforcement on the beach in an effort to address citizen concerns of littering, alcohol on the beach and glass on the beach. As a result, twenty (20) citations were issued for alcohol on the beach.

Car Seat Installation / Inspection

During the month of August 2015, Officers certified as Child Passenger Seat (CPS) Technicians assisted four (4) citizens with the proper installation of child safety seats in their vehicle.

Personnel Recognition

During the month of August, the Department had several personnel receive Employee Recognition for their performance.

Pfc. Hardy received an Employee Recognition for her efforts in organizing the National Night Out event. She was awarded a Department Challenge Coin by Chief Buckhannon for her outstanding efforts.

Detective Sergeant Swain and Detective Tarr received an Employee Recognition for their work in locating a suspect in a phone fraud that based on the scope of the criminal acts was turned over to the U.S. Secret Service for further investigation. They were awarded the Department Challenge Coin by Chief Buckhannon for their outstanding efforts.

Sergeant Thompson received citizen employee recognition for his going beyond in customer service. She was visiting, did not have a car, her husband was ill and she needed to get to the store to purchase items for his illness. Sergeant Thompson took the time to drive her to the store and back to her rental unit when she was finished.

Pfc. Reynolds received citizen employee recognition for his professionalism and conduct. It was reported that during an incident in the Sea Island Grill in Wild Dunes, a patrol who was being verbally abusive to the staff, when Pfc. Reynolds, understanding the customer aspect of Wild Dunes, worked to get the patron out of the public area and released to his companions. During the entire time, he represented himself and the City at its very best.
