The following is a synopsis of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of February 2008.

Patrol

February 1, 2008 An officer responded to Beach Club Villas where a resident complained that a male subject started banging on his door to be allowed in. The officer located the subject in a nearby parking lot where he was determined to be intoxicated. The officer assisted the subject in finding his rental unit so a friend could let him in, but no one answered the door. Due to the subject's condition and failure to locate his unit or his failure to make contact with a friend, he was taken into custody and charged with Public Intoxication.

February 2, 2008 Just after 2 A.M., an officer on patrol on Palm Boulevard observed a vehicle cross the center line several times and stopped it near 11th Avenue to investigate. After the driver failed several Field Sobriety Tests, he was taken to headquarters to be administered a Datamaster Test where he registered a .17% level of alcohol. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

February 3, 2008 Just after 2 A.M., an officer on patrol of Ocean Boulevard near 10th Avenue observed a male subject sitting parked in a vehicle in the middle of the roadway and stopped to investigate. The male subject stated he was waiting for a female subject who was in an unknown residence nearby. Due to the subject's extreme intoxicated state he was taken into custody charged with Public Intoxication and transported to the Detention Center.

February 3, 2008 An officer on patrol observed a vehicle unlawfully change lanes then got behind the vehicle to observe the vehicle and recorded additional erratic driving. When the vehicle was stopped, the officer immediately detected a strong odor of alcohol and found out that the driver's license was suspended for failure to pay two traffic tickets. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests, the driver was taken to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where she registered a .10% level of alcohol. She was charged with DUI, DUS, and 2 counts of NRVC and transported to the Detention Center.

February 5, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer, an officer responded to Middle Street where a vehicle had been stopped with multiple occupants. The officer assisted in the arrest of the occupants for marijuana possession.

February 5, 2008 An officer responded to Sullivan's Island to assist in a call involving several subjects at a bar on Middle Street. The matter was resolved and the officer returned without incident.

February 6, 2008 An officer met a Mount Pleasant police officer to assist in serving an Arrest Warrant at a residence on Morgan's Cove Drive. The wanted subject was not present.

February 6, 2008 Just before 1 P.M., owners of a residence on Ocean Boulevard entered their residence and encountered a male subject inside who stated he was at the house to fix a leaking toilet on behalf of a local plumbing company. After the owners spoke to the subject, he left through a rear door, but was unable to leave since his vehicle had been deliberately blocked in. The subject was allowed to leave after they wrote down his license plate number. Once owners spoke to the plumbing company and determined that the subject never worked for that company, they notified the police department. An Investigator searched the DMV Database and was able to get a photo of the suspect, which was positively identified by the owners as the subject that had been in their home. An Arrest Warrant for the subject was immediately obtained and the subject was located at his Mount Pleasant residence several hours later and arrested with the assistance of Mount Pleasant Police. He was charged with Burglary 2nd degree.

February 6, 2008 Mobile Crisis made telephone contact with the police department to request that we check on a suicidal female subject living on Charleston Boulevard. The officers made contact with the subject and took her into Emergency Protective Custody then transported her to the Charleston County Medical Center where she was turned over to a Charleston County Deputy who was in possession of court ordered commitment papers.

February 8, 2008 Just after midnight, an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on Waterway Boulevard near 28th Avenue for operating erratically. When contact was made with the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol and spoke to the officer with slurred speech and admitted that he had consumed alcohol. After failing several Field Sobriety Tests, the driver was transported to headquarters to be

administered a Datamaster Test, where he registered a .06% level of alcohol. The driver was also in possession of a quantity of Schedule II Narcotic pills and an open bottle of Vodka. He was charged with DUI, Illegal Transportation of Legal Liquor, and Possession of Schedule II Narcotic and transported to the Detention Center.

February 9, 2008 An officer responded to a request from the Sullivan's Island Police Department to assist with traffic control while they handled an accident on the causeway. Once emergency vehicles cleared the accident scene the officer returned to the Isle of Palms.

February 9, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer, an officer responded to a bar on Middle Street to assist with a reported fight in progress. The matter was quickly resolved and the officer returned to the Isle of Palms.

February 11, 2008 An officer stopped a vehicle on the Connector for speeding and took the driver into custody after learning that he was wanted by the Summerville Police Department and the Berkeley County Sheriff's Office. Once in custody, the subject provided information about three subjects that were on the Isle of Palms breaking into a house that were waiting for a ride from a family member. A second vehicle stopped and three others were detained while details were sorted out. Investigators were notified and responded identified the suspects. It was also determined that some family members and the suspects had been at an empty rental home on Ocean Boulevard earlier in the evening that a family member was contracted to clean. Contact was made with the owner of that house, who told officers that when she arrived from out of state earlier in the evening, unannounced, she encountered the sister of her cleaning lady and two other female subjects inside. These subjects were determined to be relatives or acquaintances of the three suspects waiting to be picked up. Investigators made arrangements with a cooperating person in the group of the detained subjects who made telephone contact with the subjects that were to be picked up. The pickup was made and they were all taken into custody. Investigators interviewed and took statements from all subjects arrested or detained and three were released pending further investigation. The subject originally stopped for speeding was turned over to the Summerville Police Department. The house that the three burglarized was located and all items that were stolen, valued at \$7,400 were recovered. An adult female, an adult male and a juvenile male were all charged with Burglary 1st degree and Grand Larceny. A Sullivan's Island Investigator who responded charged the same subjects with three burglaries in his jurisdiction, which were admitted to during questioning. Once all subjects were incarcerated, numerous additional charges related to eight other burglaries were placed on the two adults that were originally arrested. Five Arrest Warrants for the sister that was released were later issued and she was arrested on those charges on February 27th. A total of thirty-four Arrest Warrants were served on the four suspects arrested and all twenty-eight Burglaries that they were responsible for were solved, since at least two subjects were implicated in all of the Burglaries that occurred in January and February.

February 13, 2008 Just before 3 A.M., an officer on patrol stopped a speeding vehicle on the Connector and while speaking to the driver detected a strong odor of

alcohol from within the vehicle. The driver refused to comply with any Field Sobriety Tests and was transported to headquarters where he then refused to submit to a Datamaster Test. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

February 14, 2008 At the request of a Sullivan's Island police officer, an officer responded to assist with a traffic stop where a subject in the vehicle was wanted by the North Charleston Police Department. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

February 16, 2008 Just after midnight, an officer on patrol observed a vehicle fail to stop for a stop sign on JC Long Boulevard at Palm Boulevard. The vehicle was stopped on the Connector after it crossed onto the white emergency median line several times. The driver admitted that she had consumed at least six drinks and failed several Field Sobriety Tests given by the officer. At headquarters she submitted to a Datamaster Test where she registered a .19% level of alcohol. She was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

February 16, 2008 A concerned citizen reported a possible drunk driver traveling on the Connector toward the island and an officer located and stopped the vehicle on Palm Boulevard near Palm Court. While speaking to the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle and observed a box of both empty and unopened beer bottles in the van. The driver failed several Field Sobriety Tests given and was then transported to headquarters where he refused to provide a sample. He was charged with DUI and NO SCDL and transported to the Detention Center.

February 19, 2008 At the request of Sullivan's Island an officer responded to a restaurant on Middle Street to assist in a disturbance at that location. When the issue was resolved the officer returned to the Isle of Palms.

February 20, 2008 Just before midnight, an officer performing a building check to the Recreation Center encountered a male subject walking across the property. The officer then observed the subject drop his cell phone to the ground when he saw the officer. The subject was stopped and was determined to be intoxicated. A check of the subject also indicated that he was wanted by the Charleston Police Department. He was taken into custody charged with Trespassing and Public Intoxication and transported to the Detention Center. While being checked into the Detention Center, a closer search of his person revealed a plastic bag of cocaine. The subject had additional charges of Possession of Cocaine and Possession of Cocaine in Proximity of a School or Park placed on him with a hold for the Charleston Police Department.

February 22, 2008 At 2:30 A.M., officers responded to loud noises coming from a residence on Palm Boulevard and 41st Avenue and observed several subjects outside in a hot tub consuming alcohol. The officers determined that several of the subjects present were under the age of 21. The residence was inspected and five underage subjects were charged with Underage Possession of Alcohol, and one adult, who assumed

responsibility was charged with Violation of City Noise Ordinance and Transfer of Alcohol to a Minor. The rental company was advised and several subjects were evicted the following day.

February 26, 2008 An officer accompanied an Investigator from the Sumpter County Sheriff's Office to Wild Dunes regarding someone they had arrested who had solicited a minor female over the internet while working at Wild Dunes on a company computer. The Investigator received consent to inspect the computer to ensure that the suspect had contacted no other subjects.

February 26, 2008 Mount Pleasant Police contacted us to advise that they were on the telephone with a subject in a vehicle stating that he wanted to commit suicide. Through the use of the 911 tracking system, the subject was located on Oak Harbor Boulevard where arrangements were made with a family member to have him committed to a local hospital for observation.

February 27, 2008 Officers responded to a residence on Cameron Boulevard where a domestic dispute had been reported. Officers determined that the couple present had engaged in a verbal dispute and no assault had taken place. The couple agreed to go their separate way for the remainder of the night, with the husband stating that he was in the process of making arrangements to live elsewhere.

February 29, 2008 An officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for several traffic violations committed in his presence. While speaking to the driver the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol from within the vehicle and the driver submitted to several Field Sobriety Tests, which he failed. He was taken to headquarters and administered a Datamaster Test where he registered a .11% level of alcohol. He was charged with DUI and transported to the Detention Center.

Personnel/Community Relations

February 2, 2008 Sgt. Usry, PFC Brown, Ptl. Stanko, ACO Cook, ACO Keelan, and TCO Dawson attended the Isle of Palms Arcade Day at the Recreation Center. The officers answered questions from the children in attendance and registered 137 bicycles.

February 6, 2008 Chief Buckhannon, Lt. Wright, and Sgt. Usry attended a Business Council Meeting sponsored by the Charleston Metro Chamber of Commerce held at the Exchange Club. The Chief gave a PowerPoint Presentation and the three officers present fielded questions.

February 10, 2008 Chief Buckhannon received a letter of appreciation commending the officers responsible for the educational and informative presentation given recently to a local Cub Scout Pack.

February 12, 2008 ACO Cook received a letter of appreciation from a grateful citizen whose dog was lost and returned safely to her.

February 22, 2008 Sgt. Meekins met with all three 3K classes of Northside Christian School, attended by his daughter and gave a presentation in reference to the job of a police officer, stranger danger and 911.

February 23, 2008 ACO Cook held a Rabies Clinic at the Recreation Center, where almost one hundred dogs were vaccinated and issued dog licenses. She also handed out informational brochures to the animal owners in attendance.

For the month of February, officers on patrol discovered one business and four homes with open or unsecured doors. A total of one hundred and one Victim of Crime Forms were issued to business or property owners for various violations noted by officers on patrol.

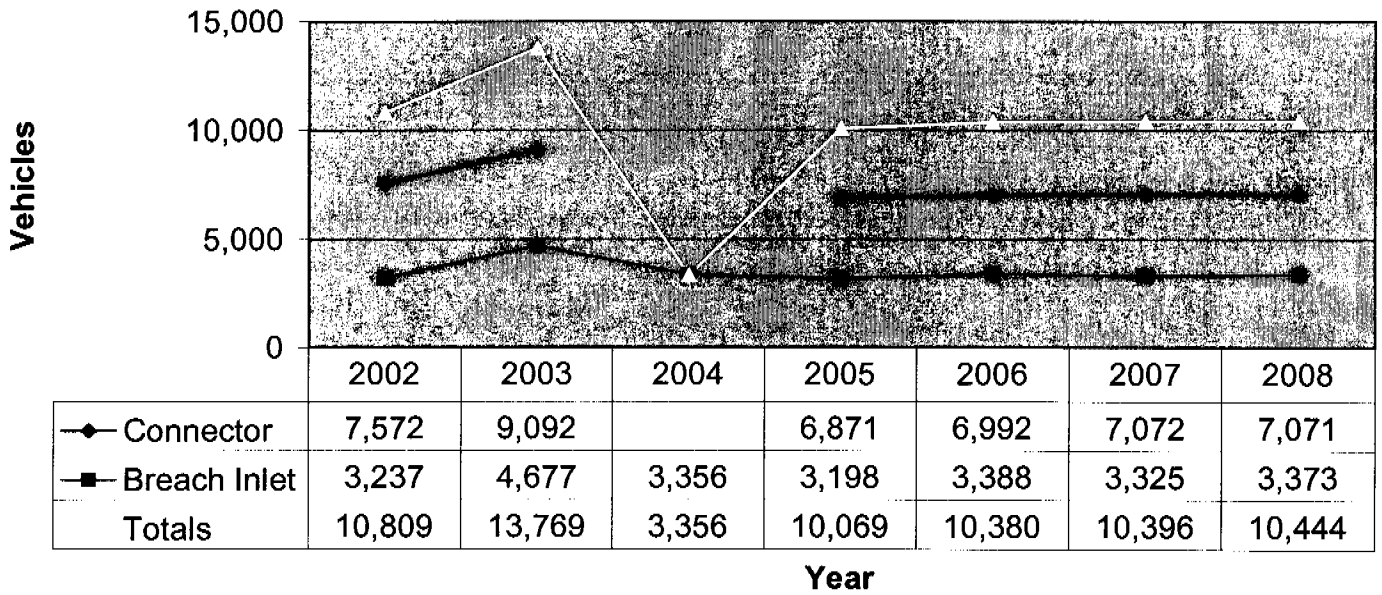
