The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of July 2015.

## Thursday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>

### Petit Larceny – 9000 Block Palmetto Drive

A victim reported that an unknown person(s) had stolen his 13-foot Sunfish sailboat, which had been chained to a tree. The value of the stolen property is approximately \$1000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that she was under the influence. The Officer asked the driver if she had been drinking, to which she advised that she only had two beers. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the testing, was placed under arrest. After being Mirandized, the driver admitted to having three beers and several shots of liquor. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she provided a breath sample with a BAC of .15%. The driver was lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

## Friday, July 3<sup>rd</sup>

### Driving Under the Influence – 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was suspected that he was under the influence. The Officer asked the driver if he had been drinking, to which he advised he only had a couple of beers. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of testing, was placed under arrest. The Officer also located an open container of beer inside the vehicle. The driver was transported to the Charleston County Detention Center for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged after refusing.

### Saturday, July 4<sup>th</sup>

#### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer was directing traffic after the IOP Fireworks event when a vehicle did not stop as directed by the Officer, almost striking him and another vehicle. Another Officer that was directing traffic at the IOP Connector intercepted the truck. After making contact with the driver, it was determined that he was under the influence. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Test and at the conclusion of the testing, was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

### Sunday, July 5<sup>th</sup>

#### Disorderly Conduct – 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue

Officers responded to a report of a disturbance between a male subject and a taxi cab driver. Contact with the subject determined that he was intoxicated and was arguing with the taxi cab driver and the other passengers. During this time, the subject began to scream profanities and continued to be unruly. The subject was arrested and lodged at the Charleston County Detention Center.

#### Burglary / Criminal Sexual Conduct 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree – 28<sup>th</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that an ex-boyfriend of several months had begun harassing her and she had told him repeatedly that their relationship was over and to leave her alone, but she had not reported it to the Police. On this date, her ex-boyfriend broke into her residence, undressed, and then began fondling her, at which point she called the Police. Officers located the male subject in the area and placed him under arrest.

### Monday, July 6<sup>th</sup>

#### Driving Under Suspension – 1500 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a golf cart for driving on the sidewalk. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined through SCDMV that his driver's license was suspended. The driver was arrested and transported to the Charleston County Detention Center.

### Wednesday, July 8<sup>th</sup>

#### Bomb Threat – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers received a report of an unknown person(s) calling in a bomb threat at a local establishment. Officers arrived and immediately evacuated several buildings in the immediate area and established a perimeter to ensure the safety of the public. The Incident Commander requested the assistance of the Charleston County Bomb Squad Team, who determined that there was no threat. This case has been assigned to CID and Federal Agencies for further investigation.

### Sunday, July 12<sup>th</sup>

#### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding, 73 MPH in a posted 55 MPH speed zone. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was under the influence. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Test and at the conclusion of testing, he was placed under arrest.

The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Tuesday, July 14<sup>th</sup>

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 3700 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his weed trimmer that had been left in the bed of his pick-up truck. The victim provided a serial number for his property, which was entered into NCIC. The value of the stolen item is approximately \$250. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, July 16<sup>th</sup>

Public Intoxication – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer on patrol recognized an intoxicated subject whom they had dealt with earlier and had been released to a family member. When the Officer made contact with the intoxicated subject and asked him why he was not with his family, he responded that they upset him so he ran away. Further investigation revealed that the intoxicated subject was unable to care for himself or provide contact information for his family member, thus he was placed under arrest and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Saturday, July 18<sup>th</sup>

Burglary – 900 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that during the night, while he and his family was sleeping, unknown person(s) entered into the residence and stole several items. The door had been locked, but the deadbolt lock was not used. The total value of the items stolen is approximately \$1240. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 700 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that during the night, while he and his family was sleeping, unknown person(s) entered into the residence and stole several items. The door was not locked, but they went to bed very late. The total value of the items stolen is approximately \$1295. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, July 19<sup>th</sup>

Hindering – 300 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of noise ordinance violation, discovering that there was loud music that could be heard from the street at approximately 3am. Further investigation revealed subjects in the pool area, who were intoxicated and had the music turned up loud. Officers attempted to identify the homeowner who would not cooperate and was ultimately arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

Public Intoxication – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a disturbance at a local establishment. When they arrived, the subject causing the disturbance fled towards another area establishment, where he was located and detained. Further investigation revealed that the subject was asked to leave the local establishment, refusing, and

ultimately striking the bouncer in the face. While investigating the incident, the subject began yelling profanities while a crowd of families was present. The subject was arrested and lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

#### Monday, July 20<sup>th</sup>

##### Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. The Officer asked her if she had anything to drink, she stated a little. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, but the driver refused. When asked if her driver's license was suspended, she indicated that it was for a previous DUI arrest. The driver was arrested and transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

##### Petit Larceny – Beach / 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his property when he went swimming, leaving his black backpack containing his iPhone and other items on the beach. The stolen items are valued at approximately \$500. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation and upon reviewing the cameras was able to determine two possible suspects and locate where they left the backpack, which was returned to the victim with all his property. CID continues to investigate to determine the identity of the suspects.

#### Wednesday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>

##### Traffic Offense / Warrant Arrest – Palm Boulevard / IOP Connector

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for disregarding the traffic signal. Upon contacting the driver, it was determined that he had an outstanding warrant with Charleston County Sheriff's Office for Fraud. The driver was arrested and released to a Deputy with Charleston County Sheriff's Office. In addition, the driver was issued a citation for the traffic violation.

#### Friday, July 24<sup>th</sup>

##### Driving Under the Influence – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The driver indicated that he had drank an unknown quantity of alcoholic beverages before driving home. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the testing, he was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he provided a breath sample with a BAC of .17% and was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

#### Sunday, July 26<sup>th</sup>

##### Driving Under the Influence – 28<sup>th</sup> Avenue / Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that she was possibly under the influence. The driver indicated that she had drunk some alcoholic beverages earlier. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the testing, she was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to

the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where she provided a breath sample with a BAC of .23% and was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

#### Tuesday, July 28<sup>th</sup>

##### Theft from a Motor Vehicle – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that while his vehicle was parked and unlocked, unknown person(s) stole his laptop, which was under a bag on the seat. The victim was unable to provide a serial number for the stolen item. The item is valued at approximately \$700. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Thursday, July 30<sup>th</sup>

##### Driving Under the Influence – 100 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The driver indicated that he had two beers earlier. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the testing, he was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

##### Petit Larceny – 50 Block of 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue

A victim reported that unknown person(s) went into her boat, which was parked in the lot, and stole fishing equipment at approximately \$1200. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

#### Friday, July 31<sup>st</sup>

##### Driving Under the Influence – 1400 Block Palm Boulevard

An Officer stopped a golf cart for driving on the sidewalk at night. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The driver indicated that he drank five beers earlier. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the conclusion of the testing, he was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to the IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

##### Driving Under the Influence – Palm Boulevard / 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue

An Officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Upon contact with the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. The driver indicated that he had been drinking earlier in the day. The Officer requested that the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety tests and at the conclusion of testing, he was placed under arrest. During the pre-town inventory of the vehicle, the Officer located an open container of liquor and drug paraphernalia with marijuana residue. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster testing, where refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was lodged in the Charleston County Detention Center.

#### Community Service / Personnel Recognition

During the month of July 2015, Officers issued five (5) "You Could Have Been a Victim of a Crime" notices and sixteen (16) Property Security Check notices.

Officers were assigned to conduct enforcement on the beach in an effort to address citizen concerns of littering, alcohol on the beach and glass on the beach. As a result, twenty-nine (29) citations were issued for alcohol on the beach.

#### Car Seat Installation / Inspection

During the month of July 2015, Officers assisted four (4) citizens with the proper installation of child safety seats in their vehicle.

#### Employee Recognition

The Department recognized the four Communications Specialists for providing great customer service to the citizens with purchasing dog licenses, getting their hurricane stickers, and among other things. They are also responsible for answering the Administrative phone for the Sullivan's Island and Isle of Palms Police Departments and directing calls to the appropriate personnel, answering questions, or transferring them to the Consolidated Dispatch Center. They make sure the Reception Office is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and provide that important first impression to citizens that come to the Isle of Palms Public Safety Building.

During the month of July 2015, the Consolidated Dispatch Center received and dispatched 5490 calls for service to the four (4) public safety agencies of Isle of Palms and Sullivan's Island, and the National Park Service. The following is a breakdown of activity by department.
