The following is a synopsis of some of the activities of the Isle of Palms Police Department during the month of May.

Monday, May 1

Theft from Building – 300 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that contractors were performing maintenance repairs on her residence and after their departure she noticed that several pieces of jewelry were missing. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$103,500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, May 6

Driving Under the Influence – IOP Connector

An officer stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations and when contact with the driver was made, determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver indicated that he had drank several shots of liquor before leaving a residence he was visiting. The officer asked the driver to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and after the completion of the tests, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he provided a breath sample that registered a BAC of .19% and was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Burglary – 200 Block Grand Pavilion

A victim reported that an unknown person entered the building through an unsecured door. The suspect then went into the office where a laptop and other items were removed. The victim was able to provide the serial number for the laptop, which was entered into NCIC as stolen. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$541. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Burglary – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a burglary in progress where a male subject was attempting to kick in a door and shouting that he was going to kill someone. When officers arrived, they located the subject and placed him under arrest. The subject was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, May 7

Petit Larceny – 1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) had stolen the vehicle license plate from her vehicle. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Buildings – 200 Block Charleston Boulevard

A victim reported that while he was staying at a rental home with several friends and acquaintances he went out to the beach, leaving his watch in his room. When he returned to the residence, he was unable to locate his watch. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$25,000. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, May 8

Motor Vehicle Theft – 2200 Block Waterway Boulevard

A victim reported sometime during the night unknown person(s) stole his vehicle that was parked in front of his residence. The approximate value of the stolen vehicle is \$8,000. The vehicle information was entered into NCIC. This case was assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, May 9

Credit Card Fraud – Ocean Park Court

A victim reported that she was contacted by her credit card company to verify a change of address. Further information found that there were several unauthorized purchases made with her credit card. The approximate value of items charged is \$583. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Building – 2900 Block Hartnett Boulevard

A victim reported that he believes a relative who has access to his tools took items without his permission. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$900. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Wednesday, May 10

Simple Assault – 600 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that when he arrived home that night, two male suspects began yelling profanities at him. The victim attempted to get away from the confrontation, but was struck multiple times. The victim stated that he suffered a contusion on his head and sprained his left knee during the assault. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Friday, May 12

Motor Vehicle Theft – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that he parked his golf cart in the business district and went to a local establishment for dinner. When he returned, he found that his golf cart had been stolen by unknown person(s). The approximate value of the vehicle stolen is \$2,500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Sunday, May 14

Theft from Building – JC Long Boulevard

A victim reported that he was notified that a subject was attempting to cash a check from his business. The victim verified that there were several checks missing from the business check book. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Monday, May 15

Theft from Building – 57th Avenue

A victim reported that he had left tools at a construction site overnight for two employees to begin working the next day. When the victim arrived at the construction site, he found that his tools were gone and the employees were not there. The approximate value of the items stolen is \$2,013. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Petit Larceny – 600 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole a paddle board that he had rented and left on the beach while he went back up to his residence. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$750. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, May 16

Warrant Arrest / Narcotics Violation – JC Long Boulevard

Officers served a warrant on a suspect working at a local establishment. During the service of the warrant, the suspect attempted to resist while officers were searching him. Officers deployed their Taser and were able to control the suspect. A search of his person incident to arrest found him to be in possession of marijuana, possession of crack cocaine with intent to distribute and charged with resisting arrest. The suspect was transported to Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, May 21

Traffic Stop / Narcotics Violation – 1200 Block Palm Boulevard

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation and upon contacting the occupants, smelled an odor of marijuana emanating from inside the vehicle. Further investigation revealed that the driver was in possession of marijuana and did not possess a valid driver's license. The passenger was found to be in possession of Schedule II Controlled Substance. Both suspects were transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Driving Under the Influence – 900 Block Carolina Boulevard

An officer stopped vehicle for speeding, 47MPH in a posted 35MPH speed zone. Upon contacting the driver, it was determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, the driver admitted to drinking 2 or 3 beers earlier. The officer then requested the driver to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and at the completion of the tests was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Burglary – 3300 Block of Cameron Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole her iPad from the master bedroom of the residence she was staying. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$400. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Thursday, May 25

Petit Larceny – Waterway Island Drive

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his kayak, which had been locked to his dock. The approximate value of the stolen item is \$750. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Saturday, May 27

Disorderly Conduct- 5800 Block Palmetto Drive

Officers responded to a report of an intoxicated male driving a golf cart. Officers located the male subject standing in the middle of the road and found that he was extremely intoxicated. When they tried to speak with him, he became uncooperative and belligerent. The subject was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Sunday, May 28

Disorderly Conduct – 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer was parked on Ocean Boulevard near JC Long Boulevard observing the large crowds walking around when a male and female subject started walking towards the officer's patrol car. The female got into the backseat of the patrol car and told the officer to take her home. The officer explained that his car was not a taxi and requested her identification. She became belligerent and gave the officer a false name. She was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Petit Larceny – Beach near Sand Dune Lane

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole his Kindle and sunglasses while his beach bag was unattended. The approximate value of the stolen items is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Assault & Battery – 23rd Avenue

A victim reported that her adult son, who was staying at her home, punched her in the face when she refused to give him cigarettes. The male was placed under arrest and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Disorderly Conduct -1100 Block Ocean Boulevard

Officers responded to a report of an unresponsive male subject lying face down and partially buried in the sand. The subject was found to be extremely intoxicated and told officers his friends had left him. Officers attempted to get information for someone to pick up the subject, but he became uncooperative and yelling profanities. The subject was arrested and transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Monday, May 29

Robbery – 30th Avenue

Two victims reported that they had been robbed at gun point of their cell phones after they had left a graduation party. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Driving Under the Influence – 29th Avenue

An officer on patrol observed a male subject parked in the state easement, who appeared to be passed out with his car running. The officer made contact with the driver and determined that he was possibly under the influence. When asked, he stated that he had a few beers earlier in the day. The officer requested the driver perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and upon completion was placed under arrest. The driver was transported to IOPPSB for Datamaster Testing, where he refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was transported to the Al Cannon Detention Center.

Grand Larceny- 1000 Block Ocean Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) stole fifteen of the businesses rental bikes, which were parked in the bike rack unsecured. Officers patrolled the area and were able to recover most of the stolen bicycles that had been abandoned at various locations on the beach. The approximate value of the stolen bicycles is \$2,600. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – 900 Block Carolina Boulevard

A victim reported that unknown person(s) entered his vehicle and stole his handgun from the center console. The approximate value of the stolen handgun is \$500. This case has been assigned to CID for further investigation.

Tuesday, May 30

Warrant Arrest – 1300 Block Ocean Boulevard

An officer investigating a noise complaint conducted a records check of several subjects at the swimming pool. A male subject was found to have an active arrest warrant with the Goose Creek Police Department for failure to appear for a simple possession of marijuana charge. The subject was arrested and transferred to an officer with the Goose Creek Police Department.
