

NOTABLE EVENTS / CALL HIGHLIGHTS

- 07/03/2021 Fire crews responded to Sullivan's Island (Station 30 Street at the Beach) to assist with retrieving individuals who had become stuck on a sandbar as the tide was coming back in. The individuals were unable to swim back to shore. Sullivan's Island launched their jet skis with Isle of Palms Fire Crews backing them up. All individuals were returned to safety with no medical needs. All units cleared from the scene and returned back to service.
- 07/04/2021 Deputy Chief Hathaway, Fire Marshal Stafford, and Sparky the Fire Dog participated in the 4th of July Golf Cart Parade.
- 07/04/2021 Fire crews responded to a missing child on the beach behind 1120 Ocean Boulevard. The 12-year-old child was last seen in the water after approximately 45 minutes to an hour. Fire Department personnel launched a jet ski and began a grid pattern search in the water while additional crews performed a land search. The child was found in knee deep water and reunited back with their family. All units cleared from the scene and returned back to service.
- 07/04/2021 Fire crews responded to a report of an outside fire on Palm Boulevard. Upon arrival, personnel found multiple areas of the residences back yard smoldering as a result of fireworks. Firefighters fully extinguished the smoldering areas and advised the occupants of the home that fireworks are not allowed on the Island. All units cleared from the scene and returned back to service.
- 07/04/2021 Fire crews responded to assist the Isle of Palms Police Department on Palm Boulevard. An individual fell out of a moving golf cart resulting in substantial traumatic injuries including the head and face. Firefighter Puckhaber (while off-duty) was at the scene and provided life saving care to the patient until Charleston County EMS arrived.




NOTABLE EVENTS / CALL HIGHLIGHTS

- 07/05/2021 Engineer Schwartz, Firefighter Sezginalp, and Firefighter Helm assisted an individual with disabilities onto and off of the beach at 21st Avenue.
- 07/06/2021 Fire crews responded to the area of Breach Inlet for swimmers in distress. Fire Department personnel assisted two individuals out of the water. Firefighters assisted with providing medical care to both individuals as well as assisted with the packaging of the patients into the ambulance for transport. All units cleared from the scene and returned back to service.
- 07/16/2021 Fire crews responded to a Motor Vehicle Accident at 21st Avenue and Palm Boulevard. The accident was a single moped versus a tree. Fire Department personnel provided medical attention and helped package the patient for transport by Charleston County EMS. All units cleared from the scene and returned back to service.
- 07/17/2021 Fire crews responded to the area of Breach Inlet in regard to a Watercraft in Distress. Jet Ski 1001 was launched and found a Catamaran that had capsized. Fire Department personnel assisted the individual from the boat back to shore. No medical attention was necessary. All units cleared from the scene and returned back to service.
- 07/20/2021 Battalion Chief Eagle, Engineers Gray and Schwartz, and Firefighters Russo and Sorger assisted in Show and Tell for the Isle of Palms Recreation Center Summer Children's Camp. Participants got to tour the fire truck.
- O7/20/2021 Fire crews responded to the isle of Palms Connector for a Motor Vehicle Accident. Once on-scene, Fire Department Personnel found a golf cart which was occupied by three individuals. It was explained that while attempting to make a U-Turn, the golf cart rolled over onto it's side. The golf cart had been placed back upright prior to the arrival of the Fire Department, and all occupants refused medical care. All units cleared from the scene and returned back to service.




INCIDENT TYPE

ANNUAL YEAR TO DATE ANALYTIC COMPARISONS






JULY MONTHLY ANALYTIC COMPARISONS







RESIDENCY TYPE ANALYTIC COMPARISONS






TOTAL CALLS IN WILD DUNES






