

Isle of Palms – Shoal Management Project

Addendum #1 – Responses to Questions- March 24, 2025

1. What will the earliest and latest times you will be allowed to work. M-F and Sat and Sun. No work will occur prior to 5am or after 9pm on any day. Work may be completed between these hours.
2. Will you be allowed to work on Memorial day? Yes
3. Will the city assist with crowd control on the beach? The City will provide public safety personnel to aid with crowd control; however, Contractor should utilize cones and signage to identify construction areas.
4. What will be the daily access point be for employees? The main construction access for heavy equipment is at 53rd Ave. Personal vehicles and small equipment may access the beach via the access point near station 262+00 and just west of the Property Owners Beach House Near station 278+00. Parking spaces here are limited to about four vehicles, so coordination will need to occur to find places for more parking if necessary.
5. Can you park equipment on the dry sand beach adjacent to the work area. Yes, though equipment should avoid vegetation to the extent practicable. Contractor may be required to replace damaged vegetation.
6. What will the access be for getting fuel and other needed supplies onto the beach? Fuel containers may be stored on the beach with appropriate containment measures, or adjacent to the beach access path at 53rd Ave. Additional areas may be made available for staging within Wild Dunes and/or on City-owned property on the island.
7. Will the city provide a dumpster for sandbags? No, contractor shall provide dumpsters as part of the bid.
8. Do all the sandbags have to be removed? Example, if they are totally buried? All sandbags are required to be removed. Contractor shall excavate to a depth and width necessary to confirm that the general footprint of the bags has been cleared.
9. What is the anticipated date for the Notice to Proceed (NTP) being issued? The City anticipates providing a NTP by 1 April 2025.
10. Are there any beach driving restrictions in place by the Town of Isle of Palms or other governing associations? There are no beach driving restrictions; however, vehicles and equipment should avoid the dry sand beach and dune areas. Traffic should run along the upper intertidal beach if possible. Efforts should be made to minimize the overall footprint of vehicular traffic and utilized dedicated haul routes when transferring sand from the harvest area to the fill areas.
